


How to login to **MyMaths**...

Log in to MyMaths
Use your school username and password to log in and access MyMaths

You must first login to the school account, the *School username* is always **bournegram**. However, the *School password* changes every year and will be given to you by your teacher. We suggest you write it down somewhere safe or store it in your phone. If you can't remember ask a friend.

Next you must login to your portal


This is where you enter your four-digit code and the three letter password that has been given to you by your teacher (We suggest you write them down somewhere safe or store them in your phone). If you have forgotten these details, ask your teacher.



Now you should be able to access your homework or assignment that you have been set, or use the resources that are available to help you practice or revise.

When you are sure you have finished the question, click **Markit** in the bottom right of the screen to mark your answers. MOST IMPORTANTLY – when you have completely finished, remember to checkout by clicking the **Checkout** tab on the left.

This will give you your scores, but more importantly will tell your teacher that you have completed your assignment. If you want to have another go, click the **Want to try again? Next** button.
